The Church in a Time of Rebuilding

Second Congregational Church in Rockford sustained severe damage from a structural fire that occurred just before Christmas in 1979.

A television station reporting on the fire showed an interview that night with Second Congregational Church's pastor emeritus, the Rev. Dr. Joseph Cleveland. I recall watching that interview and hearing Dr. Cleveland say rather confidently and matter-of-factly, "Oh, we'll rebuild! We'll rebuild!"

Second Congregational Church did rebuilt. After I was ordained in 1982 and became a pastor in neighboring Belvidere, I was in Second Congregational Church's building for meetings many times. I was in the sanctuary in 1983 for the rededication of the refurbished building. I got to know Dr. Cleveland fairly well and thought often of is confident, matter-of-fact "Oh, we'll rebuild! We'll rebuild!"

That is just the attitude we need now, isn't it? We'll rebuild! We'll rebuild.

The pandemic has not destroyed our church as a devastating fire or other tragedy might have done. But it has dismantled much that needs to be replaced. Simply re-opening for in person worship is insufficient. We have to rebuild.

What is it about our church that needs to be rebuilt?

For one thing, we will need to work at rebuilding the habit of worship attendance. Attending worship is not simply a matter of habit but it is certainly one. Regular worship attendance, and the benefits that accrue from it, happen when we do not make attending a fresh decision each week. When it is a regular part of our plan and practice attending becomes second nature if not altogether easy.

We have cultivated the habit of non-attendance over the course of the pandemic. We need now something in our spiritual lives akin to the physical therapy that retrains and strengthens muscles after joint surgery. We need to get back the "muscle memory" of our souls that makes regular worship attendance not an odd thing but the very way of our lives.

For another thing, we will need to work at rebuilding participation in worship. I fear we have become rather passive at worship over the course of the pandemic. Many of us have tuned in to the online services. We have watched them. But we

have been viewers more than we have been worshipers. I suspect that the majority of us simply sat and looked on without saying out loud the words that appeared on the screen or attempting to sing the hymns.

Several factors are going to make rebuilding participation in worship difficult, especially at first. One of those factors is that there will not be any congregational singing at all in the immediately foreseeable future. Another is that we people of Swiss and German descents tend to be among what gets called in religious circles "the frozen chosen." We are not exactly demonstrative people. About as far as we will go to show exuberant emotions in public is to laugh and to clap, but even these are done with restraint when we can help it.

But the worship of God is to be active. A church service is not something others do that we attend in order to view. It is, ideally, something we become engaged in and part of. It is to be our praise of God. So we will have to look for creative ways to rebuild participation in worship as well as attendance at worship.

The key to rebuilding attendance and participation will be rebuilding our sense of the glory of God. This is what fuels worship, supplying the energy that motivates us to attend worship and the fire that kindles passion enough to actively worship. We need to do all we can to work at remembering the goodness of the grandeur of God

Strange to say, the God who is wonderful beyond our imaginations is startlingly easy to forget. That happened already almost immediately after the Hebrew people left Egypt in the exodus. They had seen glory beyond their dreams but soon they started calling the old flesh pots back in Egypt awesome. Soon they were dancing around a golden calf they had made out of worldly treasures.

The thing that will rebuild our church is not our return to Mark Drive but our reawakening to the reality of the glory of God. If we can revel in God's faithfulness and steadfast lovingkindness; if we can revel in the wisdom that ordained the world and put all the stars in their places; if we can revel in the love that knows the hairs of our heads, the love that welcomes us in spite of our shortcomings and mistakes, the love that knows us full well and loves us anyway – then! – then we shall be well on our way to being a church rebuilt.

And the best way to know the glory of God is to reacquaint ourselves with Jesus whom God has sent. If we can come to see what he is like; if we can come to desire his companionship along life's way; if we can come to walk with him and talk with him as though he is a most faithful Friend; if we can commit to him in loving service – then! – then there is a chance the church shall rise like a phoenix.

Let's rebuild in these ways and along these lines.

It was on the Thursday of Holy Week in the Upper Room when, according to the Gospel of John, Jesus said to the disciples "a new commandment I give unto you that you love one another as I have loved you."

EASTER SUNDAY, APRIL 4

Our worship service on Easter Sunday and subsequent Sundays will take place in person and under certain restrictions.

- Worship will begin at 10:30 and last until 11:15
- Reserve a seat by using our sign-up app or phoning the church, leaving a message for Mark.
- The sign up app can be found at https://rsvp.church/r/6XQIGLk2 As of this writing 7 seats remain available.
- Masks and social distancing will be required.
- There will be no congregational singing, and no food or drink will be served.
- Fellowship and conversation are encouraged to take place outdoors.
- Entry can be gained through the doors beneath the canopy, and only the main level of the building will be open for use.
- We are not providing child care at this time.

Though we are returning to in person worship on April 4 our services will continue to be recorded for remote access through our website. This will help us to reach as many people as possible, especially persons who are as yet not in a position to worship in person. 



April's visual faith practice of *Devotion/Scripture Journaling* allows you to go beyond reading, pausing to *reflect* on what was shared in your daily devotion, *responding* by jotting down what your application or takeaway is, and then having it for *review* so you can remember. This is a very simple, but meaningful practice to add to your devotions.

In the reading, reflecting, and responding, you are receiving something from God. It may be a reminder of His faithfulness. It may be a focus on His promises. It could be a conviction or call to action. It could be a time of thanksgiving and praise. If you frame it in this way, it is a dialogue – a conversation – with God through His Word. Wherever you are on life's journey, you are welcome here!

I will give you your rains in their season, and the land shall yield its produce, and the trees of the field shall yield their fruit. (Leviticus 26:4)

Dear Youth and Families.

The transition from the winter season into spring always reinforces my faith. I love the snow and cozy darkness of winter and I love the new promise of spring. The flower bulbs, which have remained dormant under the snow, emerge as a promise in the green buds peeking through the partially thawed dirt. They fulfill that promise as they fully bloom. Those first green buds serve as an annual reminder that God is at work in both the seen and unseen. Every season has its purpose and keeps the ecosystem operating smoothly. But as much as I like both the seasons of winter and spring, I don't always love the wet, muddy, rainy days of spring that mark the change between the two seasons. But I know it is a necessary part of the process.

Similarly, our youth program is currently experiencing a leadership transition. As the rainy days of spring tell us, transitions are not always perfect or easy. The "season" before the transition and the "season" after the transition are equally important and necessary for new growth to occur. It is in each of these seasons that the mysterious work of God is taking place whether we realize it or not. As I embark on this leadership journey with our youth, I express gratitude for the leaders who have come before me and the seeds they have planted. Similarly, I pledge to cultivate the ground and plant new bulbs for future leaders who will eventually follow me.

Although, I am just beginning my role as Interim Youth Director, I am not new to the youth program at Salem. I began volunteering with Salem's youth when my son was in 7th grade (II years ago!). At the time, I participate because it was important to me that the program remained vital for my son and then eventually, for my daughter. Volunteering was my way of "doing my part". Through my role on the Youth Ministry Team, I began to grow and change in ways I never imagined. I realized that the youth were enriching my life in ways I didn't even know it needed improving. (Remember the bulb under the frozen earth of winter?) I also was able to watch our young people grow from tentative 6th graders into high school seniors with a strong faith foundation and ready to challenge the world. (Remember the flower that bloomed from the dormant bulb?)

Remember the verse from Leviticus 26:4 and I ask you to join me in this time of transition. I look forward to learning and growing alongside Salem's youth.
